CITY OF MERIDIAN SEEKS TO FILL TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION VACANCY

MERIDIAN – The City of Meridian is looking for Meridian residents who are interested in serving on the City's Transportation Commission.

This Commission is a forum for transportation planning and project development, including the advancement of a safe, efficient and multi-modal transportation network relating to roads, transit corridors, bike lanes, sidewalks, pathways and lighting. The Commission's duties include; reviewing and recommending priority road, intersection and other projects, including those contained in the Ada County Highway District's Five Year Work Plan, evaluating speed limits, identifying projects to improve pedestrian safety, and figuring out ways to improve overall safety on Meridian roadways.

Meetings are held at 3:30 p.m. on the first Monday of each month at Meridian City Hall.

The successful applicant will serve a three year term that will end on May 31, 2019. Meridian residents, Meridian business owners or people who are employed in Meridian are eligible to serve on the Transportation Commission. Applicants need to be at least 18-years-old and have a strong interest in transportation planning and traffic safety.
