MADC's goal is to advocate for good public health policy. If there is a State law change for the legalization of marijuana in any form, Meridian will take a quick proactive approach to ensure the continuation of good public health policy for Meridian residents. comments/questions have been noted and will be relayed to Sgt. Frasier for response.
4:40	Kendall Nagy, MADC Director • Possible Prevention Strategy: K9 for SRO Team	 MADC has talked about raising funds to purchase a K9 for the SRO Unit. It is often hard to reach the people who most need drug prevention and having a K9 specifically for the schools and in the schools is a proactive strategy to reduce the availability of illicit drugs in the schools while building positive relationships between youth and law enforcement. The idea of reducing possible marijuana access within the schools is a goal. Kendall is currently looking at the cost and sustainability for a new K9 for the Meridian Police Department. There are many components to be considered. Kendall's goal is to have these numbers locked in for the coalition for further discussion in January's MADC meeting. Dawn: spoke to a West Ada Schools Regional Director and he's fully supportive of this project. Earl: Thinks it would be beneficial to have a K9 within the SRO Team. administrators have said this is the most long lasting prevention impact they have seen across the <i>entire</i> student body
